<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Established a vital link through the Committee with the Academic Compliance Office to better understand the needs of mobility-impaired and disabled individuals and more effectively deploy disabled parking around the campus. ▪ Provided a forum for constituents regarding parking policies and campus management decisions on parking and transportation issues; e.g., LHS, Botanical Garden, and Space Sciences Laboratory, etc. ▪ Established an ongoing and vibrant dialogue between the committee and Parking & Transportation which is contributing significantly to improved understanding of key P&T operations and more enlightened and creative solutions to transit and parking issues of concern to the campus. ▪ Created a sense of transparency and access to information on Parking & Transportation management and operations at the highest levels of the campus and for the Committee. ▪ Evaluated Parking & Transportation funding and expense models. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Developed and recommended a parking replacement cost model for the campus. ▪ Received approval from Chancellor R. Berdahl on a recommendation to implement a multi-year financial model for parking permit fee increases. ▪ Advanced a proposal for developing parking development options on the Berkeley campus. ▪ Facilitated the discussion that resulted in a revision and standardization of docent permit fees for the campus. ▪ Initiated a proposal to consolidate all campus parking spaces under the authority of Parking & Transportation. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Reviewed and recommended approval of the <i>Bear Pass</i> program, offering faculty and staff a subsidized, flat-fee pass for unlimited rides on AC Transit, including trans-bay service. ▪ Reviewed and recommended changes to the campus shuttle operations to enable Parking & Transportation to significantly reduce operating costs for fiscal year 2004-05. ▪ Requested campus support for review of the Richmond Field Station shuttle and the Hill shuttle operations resulting in funding being advanced to continue these services while further assessments are made.
