2022-23 Annual Report of the Subcommittee on the Breadth Requirement in American Cultures

In fulfilling its charge as established in the Bylaws of the Berkeley Division of the Academic Senate, the AMCULT carried out the following activities during the 2022-23 academic year. Professor Patricia Baquedano Lopez (Education) served as chair and as an ex-officio member on the Committee on Courses of Instruction for the 2022-2023 Academic Year.

The Subcommittee reviewed a total of 59 course and instructor proposals and student petitions for satisfaction of Berkeley Division Regulation 300, American Cultures Breadth Requirements. Subcommittee members evaluated proposals and petitions to ensure courses were integrative and comparative; addressed theoretical and analytical issues relevant to understanding race, culture, and ethnicity in American history and society; and, took substantial account of groups drawn from at least three of the following: African Americans, indigenous peoples of the United States, Asian Americans, Chicano/Latinos, and European Americans.

A. Community College AC Courses: The Subcommittee discussed the amount of information that was given to for course review of Community College courses that fulfill the AC requirement. Upon review of several example articulation agreements, the Subcommittee felt that there was not enough information provided to determine if a course fulfilled the AC requirement. The Office of the Registrar provided some demographic data about who fulfills the AC requirement off campus. The Subcommittee began discussion the potential of no longer accepting AC coursework
